1 I give and bequeath to my Daughters Nancy and Mary and my son John the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars each to be paid by my Executors

2 I give and bequeath to my son John my silver watch

3 I give and bequeath to my son William the sum of two hundred dollars to be paid him by my Executor.

4 My will is that my Executor shall sell my Land that I now have in the State of Maryland and all my Personal Estate and after the Pains the above Legacies the the money a Legacy thereon shall be Equally divided between all my Children, Joshua Collierham Anne shall marry Mary John and William Collierham

5 It is my will that if my son Joshua or William shall my son in Law shall bring in any suit against my Estate, my Desire is that they or either of them shall Receive no Part of my Estate

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Joshua Collierham sole Executor of this my Last will and Testament

Witness my hand and delivred up to me of the under Sargents who became acting at the Record of the Testator and in his presence February 12th 1823
