 for my settling of my worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bestow upon  
 me I Give and bequeath as followeth Viz I Give and bequeath to my son  
 William Coppingham my Manner Plantation whereon I now live and all the  
 Land adjoining thereto lying and being on the North side of the Cool Spring Run  
 but my will is that my beloved wife Margaret Coppingham remain on the same and  
 enjoy her equal part of the use thereof during her Widowhood and at the end thereof  
 all and every part of the aforesaid Land and plantation to the only proper and lawfull  
 behoof of my said son William Coppingham his heirs and assigns forever but in  
 case my son William should die without heir of his body lawfully begotten then  
 my will is that his Land shal devolve to my son Thomas to him his heirs and assigns  
 forever Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Coppingham all the Land  
 whereof he is now possessor lying and being on the Southmost side of the Cool Spring  
 Branch and the branch to both the Divisions betwixt the Land of my son William  
 and of my son Daniel Coppingham which said Land I Give to my son Daniel to  
 him his heirs and assigns forever Item I Give and bequeath to my son Charles  
 Coppingham the Plantations in Kent County on Delaware whereon my son Jonathan  
 now liveth together with my Moveables that he had from me to him his said  
 Charles Coppingham his heirs and assigns forever Item I Give and bequeath  
 to my son Jonathan Coppingham all the Moveables he is now possessed of  
 in Kent on Delaware to him and his heirs forever as his full share of my  
 Estate Item I Give to my son William Coppingham my Case and Bottles and the  
 Couch with Leather Bottom to it likewise the Gun now called his to him his  
 said William <sup>Coppingham</sup> his heirs and assigns forever being his full Portion Item I  
 Give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Coppingham the Cow calf Hooper  
 with their Increase which he hath been possessor of for some years past being in  
 full of his Portion to him his heirs and assigns forever Item I Give to my daughter  
 Mary Nicholsons One Shilling Sterling in full of her Portion My will further is  
 that my well beloved wife Margaret Coppingham have the use of all the remaining  
 part of my personal Estate during her Widowhood and at the end thereof she may  
 be divided among my Children in manner and form following Viz One sixth part

my last will and Testament and also others by me entered into to be null
